Bravery to College Station Police Department Sergeant Travis Lacox and Investigator Andy Murph for their heroic actions to end the active shooter incident of August 13, 2012, that claimed the lives of Brazos County Constable Brian Bachmann, resident Christopher Northcliffe and seriously injured Barbara

Holdsworth.

About the award | First in Texas

The Law Enforcement Congressional Badge of Bravery was created in 2008 and honors exceptionally courageous acts in the line of duty by federal, state and local law enforcement officers. The medals are awarded annually by the U.S. Attorney General and are presented by the recipients' Congressional representative. Sergeant Lacox and Investigator Murph are the first law enforcement officers from the State of Texas to receive this honor.
